Prekindergarten Program



The program is recognized for its 3 STARS rating again this year. Thanks to the hard work of Director Mrs. Carmen Tarbox and Lead Teacher, Mrs. Meghan Perron, our state

approved PreK program will again offer faith based, play centered learning all day for only \$30 a day. We are able to receive the VT Day Care subsidy for qualifying families.

What Mr. Pomerleau Accomplished for us: 50% of his gift secured our teacher pay scales for the upcoming decade through investment in ST PAUL'S CATHOLIC SCHOOL FOUNDATION! 20% allowed our tuition assistance to work with more families in need to stay committed to St. Paul's Catholic School. 15% handled our immediate facilities needs, including an upcoming stewardship project to make our heating system more energy efficient and environmentally friendly. 15% remains in the general fund for the '17-'18 academic year.
